Responsibilities included flowing back & testing energized gasses & fluids from oil & gas wells in the Permian basin in Texas along with the North Dakota, New Mexico, Colorado, West Virginia & Pennsylvania regions. I've flowed back & tested both low & high pressure wells in H2S environments & I have manifold, line-heater, flare stack, separator, electronic flow meter & relief pumper experience. My duties entailed traveling to various locations across the US, meeting with the representative client to determine their testing criteria, & rigging up from the well head to our testing equipment to meet their specific needs. After ensuring that the equipment was ready to safely pressure up & flow back the energized fluids & gasses, I'd begin testing the well & gathering data. I would then analyze & enter this data into an electronic workbook utilizing an Excel program & email daily well reports to the client, keeping them fully apprised during flowback & testing periods & maintaining a courteous & professional working relationship at all times.

Manufactured semiconductor microprocessors in a clean-room environment for Intel. Programmed, troubleshoot & operated a variety of automated acid etching wet benches & robots necessary for the production of microprocessors in Intel's largest fabrication plant.
